About the Role

Quality Assurance arrangements in Irish Higher Education include reviews of programmes, departments, units and institutions. Reviews are carried out by a panel of experts who review reports, meet with staff and students and propose recommendations. Students are a very important part of this review panel and contribute the student experience perspective. Student reviewers are good at reading large reports and finding the areas which impact students and they have the confidence to ask questions and suggest solutions.

Important skills for student reviewers include:

- Excellent communication skills
- Good time and task management
- Critical thinking skills
- Good writing skills
- Ability to work well as a team member
- Good command of written and spoken English (IRL Level 4)

Are you interested in becoming a student reviewer? Do you find the opportunity to learn about quality assurance in Irish Higher Education appealing? Are you able to understand the perspective of other students? Do you enjoy analysing issues, discussing approaches and exploring solutions?
