STI TESTING KITS

The free at home STI testing service is now available in all 26 counties in the Republic of Ireland. Anyone from the age of 17 with an address in the Republic of Ireland can now order a free home STI test kit on the online platform by visiting www.sexualwellbeing.ie

The HSE has re-branded this service. New posters, business cards and social media images are attached in the partner pack that I have included in this email. These new posters and business cards will be available shortly to order on healthpromotion.ie.

ENDING SEXUALL VIOLENCE AND HARASSMENT FUNDING

Simon Harris has launched a new implementation plan to address sexual violence and harassment in third level education. The new Implementation Plan builds upon and complements the wide range of initiatives currently in place to support a zero-tolerance approach to issues of sexual violence and harassment that currently exist in HEIs.

This is being done through €1.5 million in funding, which will support the appointment of Sexual Violence and Harassment (SVH) Prevention and Response Managers in HEIs. On Twitter, Minister Harris announced that 7 new senior positions will be created. These new posts will further enhance the implementation of measures aimed at eradicating issues of sexual violence and harassment in our HEIs.

Funding will allow for 19 actions to be implemented to adopt a zero-tolerance approach to dealing with sexual violence on campus that will be delivered between 2022 and 2024.

Student Walkout and future actions

Without a doubt, the student walkout was a major part of the work I did over the past few weeks in both designing graphics and in chants, materials and graphics and supporting MOs when needed to ensure a campaign plan was available to get the maximum engagement.

It was incredible to see that almost 20,000 students walked out of lectures across the country, which I have to give a major thanks to all yourselves as MO officers for achieving such a feat and some incredible turnouts on many campuses, including some campuses where this had been the first oncampus protest in years.

My current work has firstly revolved reviewing the action and looking at future actions for the rest of the semester to build upon this success.

Union Partnerships and Political Engagement

As per my plan of work, a lot of what I want to do this semester is focus on building partnerships with other trade unions with the aim of creating an overall collective movement. This has been noted through support of the walkout by SIPTU, IFUT, Fórsa among others who have informed members which include students of working together. I specifically want to give thanks to the VP Academic Affairs and VP Equality & Citizenship who worked collectively on this issue

My aim as such is to look at the first steps towards building a partnership with CATU and other housing unions and improve relationships with other unions on issues of common interest.

As such, following Campaigns Strategy Committee, agreement was made that the political action that would happen is a lobby action, on the 10^{th} and 11^{th} of November and done remotely.

Campaign weeks with other policy officers

Further to my own work, my work also revolves around supporting other policy officers regarding campaign weeks and campaigns important to students. I especially want to give a kind word to the VP Academic Affairs who held an academic integrity week and as per the release of the officer report will be launching the main bit of the campaign of a fake essay mill site, given many students will be focusing on assessments that they follow academic integrity healthily and are aware of what supports they can turn to in the HEI.

I also worked with the VP Welfare to ensure we could deliver the It Stops Now campaign alongside a busy campaign time in early October with the walkout and want to give thanks for her help on this, as well as starting initial planning on resources for January on (Trigger Warning) Eating Disorders and Anti-Bullying.

Key Points Since Last Comhairle Náisiúnta

1- Meeting with NFDE and Minister of DFHERIS

On October 5^{th at} t NFDE Advisory Forum meeting, I raised the PGR stipend issue with stakeholders and representatives from HEA, DFHERIS, IRC, SFI, IUA, THEA, HRB, QQI, and HEIs. I highlighted discrepancies, gaps and inequities in the system. Lobbied for a support from IUA, HEIs, THEA members to push DFHERIS for and immediate measures to improve PGR stipend and working conditions.

On October 6th, I had meeting with Department for Further and Higher Education, Research Innovation and Science (DFHERIS). I brought up the following issues:

- Inadequate PGR Funding and Stipends (Gaps, Expense, Minimum National stipend, IUA 24K, PCAU 28k, Innovate for Ireland 28K).
- PhD working rights and conditions (research expenses, contracts, sick leaves, parental leaves etc.).
- Payment of academic support for PhDs
- Non-EU PhDs Issues (Working rights for spouses of PhD students, Stamp/naturalization, IRP& Insurance costs)
- Postgrad Fee standardization, as the cost of individual postgraduate courses, and courses for non-EU students is dictated by the institution delivering the course. The current lack of clarity on how these fees are distributed after payment. Lobbied DFHERIS to ensure greater transparency from institutions on the setting of international and postgraduate fees and how this money is used by institutions.
- Asked DFHERIS to hold a meeting with USI, and other PGR stakeholders (I.e., PCAU, PGWAi, Non-EEA PhD Society etc.).

The Minster for DFHERIS has promised a national review of state support for PhD researchers. The scope of the Review will include current PhD researcher supports, the status of PhD researchers, graduate outcomes for PhD graduates and visa requirements and duration for non-EU students.

The next line of action is to call on the DFHERIS to arrange a meeting with USI, and PGR groups in November 2022.

2- Postgraduate Workers Rights Charter

As the first stage of drafting the new national charter for PGRs, I sent the draft charter to postgraduate officers, all sabbatical officers, members of PGWG, PGWAI, PCAU, Non-EEA PhD Society, and ULPSU etc. to seek suggestions and amendments. The proposed charter includes: (1) Employee Status For All Postgraduate Researchers (2) Minimum Living Income And Benefits (3) Recognition And Payment Of Work (4) Access To Suitable Work Environment And Resources (5) Support For Teaching And Work (6) Appropriate Supervision (7) Appeal And Grievances Procedure (8) Provision of Suitable Accommodation (9) PGR Representation In Decision Making Bodies (10) Right to be Represented By Student Union And Trade Union (11) Non-discrimination (12) Rights For Non-EEA Researchers (13) Career Development Pathways (14) Equality of Opportunities (15) Standardization Of Postgraduate Fees (16) Open Access

I aim to bring the charter to the national council in December for approval, after a final consultation with student stakeholders.

3- PGR StudentSurvey.ie

I held meeting with PGR StudentSurvey.ie Group to look at the future of PGR StudentSurvey.ie and how best we support it. I emphasised the impact of financial pressures on students and encouraged the inclusion of more questions about funding in PGR StudentSurvey.ie. I submitted the need for more emphasis on results dissemination, particularly communicating back to the PGR students (about the results but also key topics like anonymity). It was agreed that there is a need to incorporating the results into QQI annual and cyclical review as well the utilisation of results by HEA and DFHERIS. The next meeting of group in December would layout future directions for the survey.

Key Points Since Last Comhairle Náisiúnta

Hi folks! I am going to do this a little differently this time round due to administrative mix ups and confusion over the role of the NUS-USI Officer on the USI Executive team! I have merged my last three Officer Reports into an update below to give insight on what I've been up to, how I work with the different teams and where I sit in relation to our governance procedures.

To give a quick beginning, I'll start off by explaining again what NUS-USI is, otherwise known as National Union of Students- Union of Students in Ireland. This means, because of the Trilateral Agreement I always go on about, NUS-USI is technically one third UK, one third the South of Ireland, and one third the North of Ireland. This means I sit on both the NUS UK Executive Team and the USI Coiste Gnó. Balancing this isn't always the easiest thing, but to give insight in terms of the working relationships, NUS UK is my administrating union. This means they look after all the admin surrounding NUS-USI, including the payment of staff, our day-to-day needs and expenses, and a lot of campaign planning. However that doesn't mean I don't communicate and work with the USI Exec Team, it just makes our interactions very purposeful.

I can be held accountable and officially communicate with members through the following forums to both HE and FE members:

- Attending Comhairle Náisúnta, and writing up an Officer Report
- Any USI Team Overall Scrutiny
- The National Scrutiny Committee for NUS UK (this holds accountable and scrutinises the NUS UK Officer Team as a whole, particularly in relation to the three nation campaign)
- NUS-USI specific Membership and Accountability Meetings

I've really loved working with all of you so far, and can't wait to continue for the rest of my term!

Please find below a summary of each section of work, and my key meetings across the July-November Period:

Cost of Survival/ Cost of Living Campaign:

The Creation:

As decided through consultation with both students and student officers, the flagship NUS-USI campaign for this academic year is on the Cost of Living Crisis. Please find linked here the full campaign briefing on our website-. The process to get this campaign to where it is now began at the first NUS UK Team Residential where we narrowed down our priorities for the year in relation to both our manifestos and current political context. It became extremely clear from the outset that Cost of Living

needed tackled- the question was just deciding how we did that. Throughout July and August through numerous meetings the NUS UK Team decided on the general themes, which then at a NUS-USI perspective, we took and created specific policy asks in relation to Northern Ireland. These were extensively researched, and then taken to a HE Officer Campaign Session where HE NUS-USI Officers had a choice and a voice on these policy asks through discussion and voting. This also included the branding (name and visuals) of the campaign, which I, along with the NUS-USI Campaigns and Influencing Consultant, created. This is where the "Cost of Survival" Campaign was born.

The Action so Far:

This is then where the campaign strategy and timeline took shape. We decided as a team to prioritise the Freshers' Period, travelling everywhere between Omagh to Belfast. Instead of using this as an opportunity to promote the organisation itself, we took a different approach and marketed our space as a campaigns stall, promoting the Cost of Survival Petition and getting a chance to speak and connect with students who have lived experience. We utilised both digital and paper signatures, now currently at approximately 1,500 signatures. We focused heavily on digital comms, including launching a new tiktok account, focusing on content creation to reach new students and increase awareness of our emergency asks: Cost of Living Payment, Rent Freeze and Free Transport, as well as our vision for education and society in the future.

This then pivoted student attention from signing petition signatures to attending one of our public meetings either in Derry and Belfast, where we both successfully lobbied for support across four political parties (Sinn Fein, SDLP, Alliance and PBP) with attendance and commitments from MLAs, and gained campaign volunteers. We have also been able to work with political reps to place questions to the relevant ministers on our asks.

After back and forth, we secured a meeting with Gordon Lyons MLA, Caretaker Economy Minister. This meeting took place on Tuesday 25th October where the following was discussed and raised:

- The Departments budget in relation to Cost of Living Payments
- DUP Party Commitments to Costs impacting students
- Funding Transport
- Finance Minister and Treasury of Westminster
- Lived Experiences and Case Studies of Students in hardship.
- The Hardship Fund and FE Financial Support

Out of this, we received a definitive commitment by the Minister and Officials to investigate barriers to the Hardship Fund, and how to increase accessibility.

Next steps include the COS Campaign Meetings Online, every other week, for any student or officer to join, to create action around the Westminster budget allocation (which so just happens to coincide with International Day of the Student), engage in meetings with Civil Servants and lobby political parties for support during the upcoming Assembly Election.

Key Wins so Far:

- Undergraduate Maintenance Loans are going to increase by 40% for the first time since 2010
- Secured a commitment to an upcoming full review of financial support in the HE and FE Education System in Northern Ireland
- Increase in Postgraduate Tuition Fee Loan Support

These wins come with their own complications- but we should still celebrate the difference we are making in our students lives so far.

NUS Charity and what that means for NUS-USI!

NUS UK and NUS Charity are two different organisations- so how do they stay connected? NUS UK and NUS Charity used to be the same organisation, but two years ago the orgs reformed to be two separate entities, whilst allowing students' unions to retain membership of both. NUS UK, the organisation which I am on the Executive Officer Team of, carries all lobbying and campaigning activity, whilst NUS Charity focuses on Union Development, Officer Training, Liberation and Trading. These are still sister organisations who work very closely together, and to ensure student representation in this organisation, 2-3 NUS UK Officers are invited to sit on its Board of Trustees.

For this year, I am one of these Trustees, but also Chair of the NUS Charity Board, meaning I am the Head of this organisation. This is why you will see a lot of work in relation to NUS Charity in this report-I took post at the beginning of September and began working on Governance, Freedom of Expression and day-to-day needs of Unions. I was happy to accept this position as I am utilising it to ensure Northern Ireland voices are not left behind and get access to development and training.

Belfast Pride

It was absolutely amazing to see so many of you turn out for Belfast Pride this year, and stand up for our LGBTQIA allies in the student movement. We remembered pride is still a protest, with a particular focus on Banning Conversion Therapy, but still celebrated who we are and our identities. Belfast Pride work was divided into promotion, organisation of the Pride Breakfast, and then the Student Bloc itself. Thanks so much to UUSU for hosting us!

FE Engagement:

NUS-USI represents a wide range of students, and something we are incredibly conscious of, is how we can continue to nurture and grow the student movement across Further Education Colleges. Due to the Officer Election cycle being very different to Higher Education Institutions, we engage with these officers (in the main) later on in the year, and work with a lot of Further Education Staff on the ground. Between engagement with Belfast Met SU's President, SERC's Governor and staff across other further education colleges, we have fed into discussions on FE Support Payments, BAME Experience and Cost of Living, particularly transport and food costs, in these colleges.

Climate Activism and COP27:

NUS-USI are members of Climate Coalition NI, the largest environmental network in Northern Ireland, with other organisations like the National Trust, Friends of the Earth, and RSPBNI. This is impactful to engage in as this group is currently focusing in on the intersectionality of the climate crisis and the cost of living crisis. Both in relation to the upcoming COP27 (for Belfast, the Global Day of Action on Climate), and policy/lobbying asks. This includes housing conditions, energy bills, clean transport and food poverty.

In my personal capacity, I am also Vice-Chair of the network, which has led to the student perspective being prioritised in top-level climate briefings heavily. We are currently working towards delivering the student bloc of the COP27 March in Belfast on Saturday 12th November.

Gender Violence:

This piece of work is our secondary campaign for my time in term- we will be focusing on this in more detail post-Christmas. For now, we have worked with our local Union members who maintain representation on key groups, particularly in relation to the Strategy on Violence against Women and Girls. We have made representations to local councils and Political Representatives on spiking culture, speaking on Good Morning Ulster about the importance of putting spiking testing centres in bars in Belfast.

Student Housing Cooperatives:

NUS-USI passed a motion at the last conference in support of housing cooperatives and gave a mandate to work with the Belfast Student Housing Cooperative Group. This work is primarily led by Ryan Harling, previous UUSU Officer, with amazing leadership exhibited by Grace, UUSU President, and Robert, UUSU VP Belfast. I have supported this group where I can by attending meetings, giving input on student engagement strategy, sharing information on NUS-USI Social Media and Newsletters and raising the cooperative to politicians.

Due to stretched resource, particularly in relation to the NUS-USI Staff Team shortage due to a member of the team being off on Maternity Leave, I have not been as hands on as I would have liked to have been. Going forward it will be great to discuss how NUS-USI can involve other staff members and impactfully contribute to the group.

Quality Assurance Agency:

The Quality Assurance Agency is a UK based firm, contracted by the government, further education and higher education institutions to monitor, evaluate and record best practice of teaching and learning across the four nations. This covers Northern Ireland. Post engagement through meetings surrounding the importance and needed implementation of an external review for institutions here, I was invited to speak at their day-long, online, NI specific conference on Embedding Quality Enhancement across Institutions. I delivered a small section on student voice, and participated in the key note panel discussing the benefits of student staff partnership on these matters.

Trilateral:

As I have previously mentioned, the Trilateral Agreement is what keeps NUS-USI, NUS-USI. It celebrates cross country solidarity and embraces collectivism and collaboration across the student movement of UK and Ireland. The official structure of this agreement allows for three formal meetings a year: one in the North, one in the South and one in England. We hosted the first one in Northern Ireland in October shortly post Freshers where reps from NUS UK and USI came and discussed SUT, the IIA, collaboration and training, a new framework of engagement and NUS-USI's 50th anniversary. At this meeting it was decided NUS-USI would host a celebration in February.

Freedom of Expression

Currently, passing through the House of Lords, is a Bill in relation to Freedom of Expression. Through my role in NUS Charity, I have supported both Durham SU and staff to create a "Write to the Lords" action highlighting the position of student officers of threatening both their right to opinion and protest.

Apprentices

I have been working with the National Society of Apprentices to further the position and rights of Apprentices across Northern Ireland. In the Apprentice Strategic Advisory Forum we raised issues directly in relation to the Cost of Living Crisis, and for the first time by industry leaders and the Department of the Economy got recognition that there needs to be reflection and work progressed Fair Pay for Apprentices. This has recently become particularly prominent due to the move by Department of Economy to promote all age Apprenticeships, as lack of financial compensation rules out a lot of potential students with responsibilities, and creates a class issue in terms of access. Civil Servants in DfE are going to be following up on this in the coming weeks.
