- 3. Items for information
  - a. StudentSurvey & RGE StudentSurvey [Siobhan Flanagan]
    - i. Main ticket item: PGR students will have a fieldwork element to the survey. This is a biennial activity to avoid undue burdens on students. Siobhan wants help promoting this amongst our PGR communities. Response rates in the past have been around 30% nationally. Use this data to push institutions to make changes and reach out to Siobhan if there are things you want/need from the data.

  - b. Research and Graduate Education committee meeting update.
    - €30 million to invest in creating links between Northern Ireland and ROI. Unclear how this will be allocated.
    - New award being created by the IRC (the Lauriet Award) that is more accessible funding for early stage researchers (first few years of their PhD).
    - iii. Next meeting isn't until May.
  - c. Postgraduate Funding Northern Ireland
    - Launch of #FundOurEducation campaign course costs are rising and supports are not. USI has engaged with the social media campaign. Most of the data is very focused on the UK/NI connection, there is less info on the NI/ROI connection. <u>Vp.education@uusu.org</u> for more help.
  - d. Postgraduate Capacity Building
    - i. About half of the M.O.s have completed the survey. Will be closed over winter break.

- 4. Items for discussion
  - a. Postgraduate Taught fees 2020/21 [Nicole Carr]
    - i. PG students are still paying fees but don't have access to resources like space in the library at Maynooth and fee reductions seem unlikely. Especially relevant to PME students who have a significant amount of work in person. There needs to be transparency about what the fees are going to.
    - ii. Kevin: the fees from PGs are not supported by the government so there is less leverage. Institutions use PG and international fees to subsidise UG education. Especially re: transparency, it is justified to be calling for to see where our fees go. Must be cautious that we don't end up challenging the value of edu as a public good. May use FOI requests – Padraic Toomey from NUIG is an expert here.
      - 1. Padraic: FOIs are time sensitive so move quickly. They can take time to get through. Ask for reference numbers.
  - b. #CantGetHome Campaign
    - Soft launch is next week where social media will be used to gather the stories of international students who are unable to return home. Stories will be shared the following week.
      December 14<sup>th</sup> will be the full launch trying to get people to like and retweet. Hoping to get as many videos as possible, regardless of where international students are from and attending.
